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Calaveras County Emergency Operations Plan (EOP). The EOP outlines the functions, responsibilities, and regional risk assessments of Calaveras County for large scale emergencies (i.e. wildland fires, hazardous materials incidents, flooding, dam failure, light airplane crashes, etc.) and sets forth the planned response for managing these incidents. The plan addresses initial and extended emergency response and the recovery process.

Calaveras County Hazardous Materials Area Plan provides the response guidelines for hazardous materials incidents in compliance with state law. The plan is updated regularly. Copies of the plan are available at the Calaveras County Department of Environmental Health.

Calaveras County Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP). The LHMP identifies hazards, methods to reduce threats and/or eliminate long-term risks to people and property from multiple hazards. It contains an initial earthquake performance evaluation of public facilities providing essential services, shelter and critical governmental functions; an inventory of private facilities that are potentially

hazardous; and a plan to reduce the potential risk to private and governmental facilities in the event of a disaster. The General Plan Safety Element reflects the analyses and recommendations of the LHMP. In addition to availability at the Sheriff's office, the adopted LHMP can be found on the California Emergency Management Agency's (CALEMA) website.

Calaveras County Public Works Department. *Calaveras County Grading, Drainage and Erosion Control Design Manual*. Prepared by the Calaveras County Public Works Department, the manual provides procedures, standards, and requirements necessary to safeguard public health, safety, and welfare from geotechnical related hazards. The manual is updated periodically. The current version of the manual can be found at the Calaveras County Public Works Department.
